Objectives

The program seeks to strike a balance between active and quiet times, as well as indoor and outdoor activities. Participants will have the opportunity to take part in a variety of recreational and educational activities, including arts & crafts, music, painting, tales and visits from special guests.

Behaviour

The staff is responsible for setting and enforcing the behavioural limits required to ensure the participant's health and safety. If a child does not respect the set limits, he may be removed from an activity or situation.

Medication

Staff are not authorised to give any child medication.

Required material

To ensure your child's comfort, please dress him properly for each activity and according to the temperature outside. A change of cloths for your child is required at each activity.

Snacks

If your child is allergic or does not like the snack indicated on the schedule, please give him one from home.

Illness

Staff will refuse a child who presents the following symptoms:

- fever above 101°F or 38.5°C;
- contagious disease (parents must advise the staff);
- vomiting or diarrhea;
- head lice (the child will be isolated until a parent or guardian picks him up and will be able to return after he has been treated.)

If a participant becomes ill on site and presents one or more of the above-mentioned symptoms, the parent will be advised and required to pick up their child within the next 30 minutes.

Suspected case of child abuse

In accordance with the *Family Services Act*, any suspected case of child abuse or bullying must immediately be reported to the Department of Family and Community Services.

Child custody

In the event of a separation or divorce, the parents must provide the City with a copy of the legal document indicating who has custody of the child. This will allow the staff to appropriately manage the child custody issue according to the custody rights detailed in the legal document. Parents must also inform staff of any changes to the custody agreement in order to avoid any confusion between the parents and staff.

Payment

No refunds.

Non-sufficient-funds checks

A \$20 fee will be applied to all non-sufficient funds.

Integrating your child

During the first session only we will allow parents to stay longer than the drop off period in order to help their child integrate into the program. However, after the first session we will not accept the presence of parents in the room. You will be asked to wait in the foyer area in order to allow your child to integrate in the program.

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
